Dear Parents,

Departure time for Philmont is rapidly approaching, and there are a few details that need attention before we leave. Your son has been given two documents, a booklet from Philmont and a packet of photocopies from the Baltimore contingent leaders. These should cover most questions about personal equipment, spending money, mailing addresses, and so forth. If you have any additional questions, please feel free to call me at 255-2433.

If you plan to send any mail, our expedition number required in the address is 716H-11. Please send any mail early, as delivery is slow on the trail. We have been told that any mail that arrives after we return to Baltimore will likely be trashed. I would suggest sending any letters by July 17.

We will be spending almost two weeks on the trail, experiencing significant physical and sometimes mental/emotional stress. If there are any special conditions of which I should be aware, <u>please</u> contact me. The contingent leadership has been forced on a few occasions in the past to send boys home early.

The last issue is medication. A tear-off form at the bottom of this page is provided if you wish to allow the adult leaders to provide your son with over-the-counter, non-prescription, oral medications such as Advil or stomach upset remedies. This is not required, but we cannot administer oral medication without your written permission. If your son will be bringing any medication, we need to know about them. A space is provided on the form for this information as well. If he requires any critical medication such as asthma inhalants or bee sting antiallergens, please provide us with duplicate prescriptions so that the adults can carry an emergency backup.
